DEPARTMENT OF POLICE NOTICE 20 OF 2020

PRIVATE SECURITY INDUSTRY REGULATION ACT, 2001 (ACT NO. 56 OF 2001): EXEMPTION IN TERMS OF SECTION 1(2) AND 20(5) OF THE ACT

By virtue of the power vested in the Minister of Police by sections 1(2) and 20(5) of the Private Security Industry Regulation Act, 2001 (Act No. 56 of 2001). I, Bheki Hamilton Cele, hereby determine that Association of Fraud Examiners South Africa (ACFESA) are exempted from the provisions of section 20(1) (a) of the Private Security Industry Regulation Act, 2001 (Act No. 56 of 2001), for a period of five years from the date hereof, on condition

that-

- ACFESA provide PSIRA with the list of all their members who wish to be exempted from the application of the PSIR Act;
- ACFESA must ensure that such list contain all its members who have been criminally vetted against the records of the Criminal Records Centre and are also compliant with the registration requirements of section 23 of the PSIR Act;
- The exemption will only be in respect of section 23(1)(i) which deals with requirements of payment of the application fee, the requirements of section 23(1)(a) up to (h) including (i) and including (j) and the rest of the section will remain applicable;
- ACFESA is further exempted from the requirements of annual fees, in terms of section 32 of the Security Officers Act 1987 and section 44(7) of the PSIR Act;

- This waiver will automatically fall away when the Levies Act comes into operation; and
- That each member of ACFESA whose application for exemption has been approved will appear on PSIRA's database as prescribed in terms of section 24.
